Why: During its June meeting, the Board of Regents approved GRAD Act designations for participating institutions allowing those that pass to raise tuition by 10% and receive 15% of their funding formula allocation. SUSLA appealed its preliminary designation of RED indicating that it had failed to make sufficient progress on the GRAD Act. The board authorized the Executive Committee to consider SUSLA's designation on its behalf in order meet the July 15th deadline for submission of an Annual GRAD Act Report to the Governor and Legislature.
