



The Iron Triangle









Modality SCH Growth








Online Exclusive Headcount by Semester

Fall 2009 Final Student Headcount (w/Rosen)









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UCF Online Growth Trends






UCF Online Enrollment




UCF Online Demographics











Transfer Student Grade Distribution: UCF Online and Non-UCF Online




Achievement gaps are smaller for Pell and minority students in mixed modality & online courses

...and slightly smaller achievement gap for minorities¹ vs. face-to-face






Share of <u>SCH</u> in each modality¹ taught by faculty vs. adjuncts or GTAs, AY15-16




Share of <u>sections</u> in each modality¹ taught by faculty vs. adjuncts or GTAs, AY15-16
